Re: Freedom of Information request 202334- Request Refused.

Dear,

I refer to your request dated and received on 01/09/2023, which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 (FOI Act) for records held by the Land Development Agency (LDA).

• a copy of the presentations/slideshows/notes associated with the land seminars delivered by Michelle Norris [and as referenced in the board minutes of 27 Oct 2022].

I wish to inform you that I have decided to <u>refuse</u> your request on the 31st August 2023.

The purpose of this letter is to explain my decision.

1. Findings, particulars and reasons for decisions to deny access.

Upon receipt of your request, it was forwarded to the relevant section within the LDA for search and retrieval of records within the scope of your request. In this regard, I am to advise you that the records as sought by you are already in the public domain.

I have been informed that the land seminars to which your request relates are the "Talking about Land" series that the Land Development Agency co-ordinated with the Housing Agency.

This page contains links to video recordings of the seminars on the Housing Agency's YouTube account as well as .pdf copies of the slides used by the speakers.

Therefore, I am refusing your request in accordance with Section 15(1)(d) of the Freedom of Information Act 2014, which states:

Refusal on administrative grounds to grant FOI requests.

- I5(1) A head to whom an FOI request is made may refuse to grant the request where:
 - (d) the information is already in the public domain,





2. Right of Appeal

In the event that you are unhappy with this decision you may appeal against it. If you need to make such an appeal, you can do so by writing to the Freedom of Information Unit, Land Development Agency, 2nd Floor, Ashford House, Tara Street, Dublin 2 or by e-mail to foi@lda.ie.

You must ensure that your FOI reference number (FOI 202334) is included in the payment details.

You should make your appeal within 4 weeks from the date of this notification, where a day is defined as a working day excluding the weekend and public holidays. However, the making of a late appeal may be permitted in appropriate circumstances. The appeal will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of the staff of this body.
