## **Re: Freedom of Information request 202426 – Request Refused.**

Dear

I refer to your request dated transferred to the LDA on the 26<sup>th</sup> of November 2024, which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 for records held by this FOI body.

We believe an Archaeological survey took place in 2023. We have seen the report done in January 2024 but believe there was an earlier survey completed. We request all information regarding this site in respect of any surveys carried out.

I wish to inform you that I have decided to <u>Refuse</u> your request on January 21<sup>st</sup>, 2025.

The purpose of this letter is to explain that decision.

## 1. Findings, particulars and reasons for decisions to deny access.

Upon receipt of your request, it was forwarded to the relevant section within the LDA for search and retrieval of records within the scope of your request. I was informed in response that the request was too voluminous and would result in excess of 600 records and required a reduction of scope, we notified you of this in a letter on the 11<sup>th</sup> of December, 2024. To date we have received no response from you.

Therefore, I am refusing your request in accordance with Section 15(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act 2014, which states:

#### Refusal on administrative grounds to grant FOI requests.

I wish to inform you that I am refusing this section of your request in accordance with Section 15(1)(c) of the FOI Act.

15.(1) A head to whom an FOI request is made may refuse to grant the request where— (c) in the opinion of the head, granting the request would, by reason of the number or nature of the records concerned or the nature of the information concerned, require the retrieval and examination of such number of records or an examination of such kind of the records concerned as to cause a substantial and unreasonable interference with or disruption of work (including disruption of work in a particular functional area) of the FOI body concerned,



# 2. Right of Appeal

You must ensure that your FOI reference number (FOI 202426) is included in the payment details.

However, the making of a late appeal may be permitted in appropriate circumstances. The appeal will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of the staff of this body.
