

About the Land Development Agency

The Land Development Agency (LDA), established in September 2018, is a key Government land management initiative to development public land for housing delivery. The LDA will be overseen by an independent board of directors and the Government has committed to providing the LDA equity of up to ≤ 1.25 billion.


The LDA will improve the way the housing market functions by

- Working with State bodies and local authorities to make more effective use of State lands, providing a stable, sustainable supply of land for housing.
- Improving the planning system to facilitate State lands being used for housing.
- Acquiring and developing land in a selective, targeted way that boosts housing supply.
- Delivering rental market initiatives that provide affordable mass-market tenure.
- Investing in research and innovation to identify new and better ways to deliver new homes.
- Providing high-level expertise underpinned by robust governance.

Key numbers

- 10 sites in design / planning / construction
- 60+ LDA Staff (multiple office locations planned)
- 862 Number of homes in the first two LDA projects commencing construction this year
- 2,900 planning lodgements in 2022 (homes)
- 5,000 homes capacity of state land where LDA is advancing development process
- 5,000 homes targeted through 'Project Tosaigh'
- C. 20,000 homes state land capacity after 'Housing for All' land commitments
- €3.5 billion capital capacity


